
Shaykh al-Albaanee (رَحْمَةُ اللَّهِ) in an overturned car ...

بِسْمِ اللَّهِ الرَّحْمَنِ الرَّحِيمِ

“Shaykh Alee Khashhaan (حفظه الله)¹, in a piece he wrote entitled, ‘The Aider of the Hadeeth and the Reviver of the Sunnah, Naasirud-Deen al-Albaanee’, said, “So by Allaah! My eyes have never seen—as far as I know—anyone who cared more about the Sunnah and aided it with greater vigour or followed it more than al-Albaanee (رَحْمَةُ اللَّهِ)². One time between Jeddah and Madinah an-Nabawiyyah [he had an accident] and his car overturned and the people present rushed to him saying, “O Sattaar! O Sattaar! يا ستار! يا ستار! [i.e., O Concealer, meaning Allaah].” So the Aider of the Hadeeth, Shaykh al-Albaanee says to them while he is under the overturned car, “Say, ‘O Sitteer [يا ستير]’ and don’t say, ‘O Sattaar [يا ستار], because al-Sattaar is not one of His Names, the Most High!”

And in the hadeeth there occurs, “إن الله ستير يحب الستر” – **Allaah is characterised by modesty and concealment [sitteer] and loves that people conceal themselves.**³

Have you seen anyone who aids the Sunnah and the Hadeeth in a situation such as this in this time of ours?! Never! Except for what has been related from the likes of Umar ibn al-Khattaab (رضي الله عنه)⁴, Ahmad ibn Hanbal (رَحْمَةُ اللَّهِ)⁵ and others from the Pious Predecessors of this nation.”⁵
